

## **Visiting Rand Club**

Rand Club is an elegant, formal building showcasing Edwardian architecture in Johannesburg at its finest. Every effort is made to ensure that your Rand Club experience is memorable.

As with every Club, there are rules to be observed. Members will wish to ensure that they are familiar with these in order to avoid any embarrassment to themselves or their guests.

Members are responsible for the dress of their guest(s) at all times and in all public areas. The dress code standard may be varied for private functions.

Visitors to the Club who do not meet the required Dress Code may use the facilities in Benders Arms at 97 Fox, where no dress code applies.

## **Dress Code**

The minimum requirement of dress is:

Gentlemen: Business Casual, which includes:

Button-fronted collared shirt tucked in with fitted trousers, corduroys or

chinos. Jacket optional (but preferred).

Traditional African dress (including Nehru collars).

Business Formal (suit, tie and jacket) is always acceptable.

**Ladies:** Smart Casual. Ladies may wear sandals.

All: T-shirts of any kind, jeans, leather jackets, golf / polo shirts, trainers, sports /

active wear and shorts are not acceptable.

## **Device usage policy**

Personal handheld electronic equipment may be used discreetly in silent mode in all public areas of the Clubhouse. Videos and music, with or without headphones, are not permitted except in the Business Suite.

Voice calls may only be taken on the ground floor porch, in the phone booths on the ground floor adjacent to the Porters' Lodge, or on the first and second floor balconies.

The use of larger electronic equipment, including laptops and large tablets, is discouraged in public areas of the Clubhouse except the Business Suite and the Library.
